The ALA South Central Group are pleased to invite you to its Summer Estate Tour of The Grange, Northington, Hampshire, SO24 9TG on **Tuesday, 11 June 2019**.

The Estate has had a colourful history and now is in a phase of multiple diversifications which you will hear about during the afternoon: the opera festival, vineyard and re building of the dilapidated model farm are some examples. Mark and Sophie Baring will be leading the tour and are very interested to get your ideas and thoughts.

The Grange and its Park have a history stretching back several hundred years – encompassing a royal tenant, a succession of banking families and requisition during the 2nd World War. After the house remained vacant and deteriorating post being re-acquisitioned by the Barings it was taken into the guardianship of the Department of the Environment (now English Heritage) in the 1970's, in view of its architectural significance. The freehold remains with the Baring family and a 570 seat auditorium was built in 2001.

ABBOTSTONE FARMHOUSE AND BARN, ABBOTSTONE, ALRESFORD, HAMPSHIRE, SO24 9TE

FROM ALRESFORD

Turn into Broad Street (B3046). Head down hill, around right hand and then left hand bend – with Globe Pub on your right. Bear left after Alresford Pond and take first left signposted “Abbotstone” (this is Abbotstone Road). Follow this road for approximately 2 miles (past a group of houses on your right) and continue for approximately half a mile. As you head down the hill take the right hand turn signposted “Abbotstone Farm House/Abbotstone Barn/Garden Cottage”, to arrive at a gate on your left. Go through this gate, keep right and follow tarmacked drive. Parking is opposite the stables on the right. If you park there you can either make your way down the little hill to the farmhouse or further along the track to the door of the barn which is opposite the tennis court.

FROM LONDON

M3 – exit at Junction 7

Turn right at the roundabout signed to Basingstoke. After about 200 yards turn left at the traffic lights to Kingsworthy A33. Follow the A33 for about 5 miles and take the turning the East Stratton on the left about a mile after the dual carriageway has ended. Carry on through the village for about 2 miles to a crossroads. Go straight across and continue for about 1 mile until the road forks at the end of the woods on the left. Turn left and proceed down into the Candover valley, bearing left at a 3 way junction towards Alresford. After 100 yards cross a bridge and turn immediately left, following signpost “Abbotstone Farm House/Abbotstone Barn/Garden Cottage”, to arrive at a gate on your left. Go through this gate, keep right and follow tarmacked drive. Parking is opposite the stables on the right. If you park there you can either make your way down the little hill to the farmhouse or further along the track to the door of the barn which is opposite the tennis court.

FROM A303 AND THE WEST

Having already passed one turning to Micheldever Station, leave the A303 at the 2nd turning to Micheldever Station and Overton. Turn right at the T-junction and continue to a crossroads. Turn left and follow the road for about 2 miles to the junction with the A33. Turn right towards Winchester and take the next left to East Stratton. Drive through the village for about 2 miles to a crossroads. Go straight across and continue for about 1 mile until the road forks at the end of the woods on the left. Turn left and proceed down into the Candover valley, bearing left at a 3 way junction towards Alresford. After 100 yards cross a bridge and turn immediately left, following signpost “Abbotstone Farm House/Abbotstone Barn/Garden Cottage”, to arrive at a gate on your left. Go through this gate, keep right and follow tarmacked drive. Parking is opposite the stables on the right. If you park there you can either make your way down the little hill to the farmhouse or further along the track to the door of the barn which is opposite the tennis court.
