### 2. Coronavirus Act 2020

The Coronavirus Act received Royal Assent on 26 March.

The Act will touch all our lives in some form. Of particular interest to Members in advising rural businesses are the following Sections:

Sections 25-29 Food Supply Sections 39-44 Statutory Sick Pay Section 52 Powers relating to events, gatherings and premises Sections 53-57 Courts and tribunals: use of video and audio technology Sections 72-74 National Insurance Contributions Section 81 Residential tenancies: protection from eviction Sections 82-83 Business tenancies: protection from forfeiture etc

Schedule 15 Information relating to food supply chains: financial penalties Schedule 29 Residential tenancies in England and Wales: protection from eviction

# 3. Agriculture Bill

At the time of writing, the Bill had reached the Report stage of its passage through the House of Commons following the Committee debates.

#### 4. Environment Bill

At the time of writing, the Bill was being considered by the Public Bill Committee following its second Reading in the Commons on 26 February.

# 5. Rented Homes Bill

At the time of writing, the Bill had reached the 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading stage of its passage through the House of Lords.

In summary, the Bill proposes to:

- Amend the Housing Act 1988
- Abolish Assured Shorthold Tenancies in England
- Introduce amendments to existing grounds for possession under Schedule 2 and introduce to Schedule 2, new grounds for possession of assured tenancies in England and Wales
- Provide for exceptions for tenancies entered into prior to the Act coming into force subject to a 'longstop' provision of three years

It is important to note that subsequent amendments to the draft Bill may come forward during its passage through Parliament and updates will be provided to Members as the Bill progresses.

Members in Wales should also keep in mind the Rented Homes (Wales) Act 2016 and the provisions of that Act that the Welsh Government are intending to bring forward to replace Assured and Assured Shorthold tenancies. #### 6. Environmental Land Management Scheme

DEFRA published a policy discussion paper on the proposed ELM Scheme on 25 February. The discussion paper invites comments with a deadline for responses of 5 May.

DEFRA published of their response to the agricultural tenancy consultation (held in 2019) on 17 March.

Those proposals which DEFRA have chosen to adopt are set out in the draft Agriculture Bill although there is a significant level of detail that will come forward in secondary legislation and we await further details on those provisions from DEFRA.

In addition, DEFRA's response includes comments on those aspects of the consultation proposals which have not found their way into the draft Bill but which may still be considered by DEFRA with industry stakeholders.
