2. WELSH GOVERNMENT - DRAFT WATER RESOURCES REGULATIONS

On 9 April, the Welsh Government published their draft of The Water Resources (Control of Agricultural Pollution) (Wales) Regulations 2020 and explanatory note – see <u>https://gov.wales/draft-water-resources-control-agricultural-pollution-wales-regulations-2020</u>

Whereas the requirements under the Nitrate Pollution Prevention (Wales) Regulations 2013 applied only to holdings situated in designated Nitrate Vulnerable Zones, the new Regulations would apply to all holdings in Wales.



The Welsh Government points out that these have been made available so that stakeholders can see their proposed approach but state that a final decision on whether they will be introduced has not been made.

We will include a more detailed article on the draft Regulations in the Spring Bulletin.

3. SCOTLAND – REVIEW OF THE TENANT FARMING COMMISSIONER

The Scottish Government published its Review of the functions of the Tenant Farming Commissioner on 1 April.

The key recommendations are:

- 1. To foster compliance with the codes of practice, the Tenant Farming Commissioner should be granted the authority to sanction and impose financial penalties on anyone found to have been in breach of the codes of practice.
- 2. To continue the delivery of additional guides and information for landlords, tenants and agents, the provision and promotion of guidance, information and advisory documents should be added as a function of the Tenant Farming Commissioner.
- 3. To keep pace with the changing nature of the business arrangements of agricultural holdings, ministers should consider extending the remit of the Tenant Farming Commissioner to include alternative business arrangements, such as joint ventures and business partnerships.
- 4. To further encourage good relations among landlords and tenants of agricultural holdings and their agents, the Tenant Farming Commissioner may adopt the additional function of providing mediation services where the relationship between tenants, landlords and agents has deteriorated but codes of practice have not necessarily been breached.
- 5. Where not already happening, the Tenant Farming Commissioner should be consulted on matters of land reform and agricultural tenancy.

Inheritance Tax

William Charnley & Malcolm Hodgkinson (Exors of the late Thomas Gill v HMRC

[2019] UKFTT 650 (TC)

Agricultural property relief – Business property relief – whether dwelling was a farmhouse – nexus between farmhouse and land – agricultural purposes - whether business wholly or mainly consisted of holding investments – appeal allowed



Access to land under a Development Consent Order

John Sawkill v Highways England Company Limited [2020] EWHC 801 (Admin)

Section 53 Planning Act 2008 - Section 172 Housing and Planning Act 2016 - - power to enter onto land to undertake tests - discharge of pumped groundwater onto land - whether or not it is a permissible activity covered by the power to undertake surveys in any event

6. 2020 BPS CLAIMS

England:

The Rural Payments Agency has extended the deadline for submitting BPS claims to 15 June (<u>https://www.gov.uk/government/news/two-month-window-to-claim-for-farm-payments-for-2020-opens</u>)

Wales:

This follows the Welsh Government announcement on 1 April to extend the deadline to 15 June for submitting Single Application Forms (<u>https://gov.wales/emergency-measures-support-farmers-during-covid-19-unveiled</u>)

Scotland:

At the time of writing, the Scottish Government has not yet followed with extending the deadline in Scotland for submitting Single Application Forms. It remains 15 May at present.
